

**Minutes of

Date: 06th April 2024**

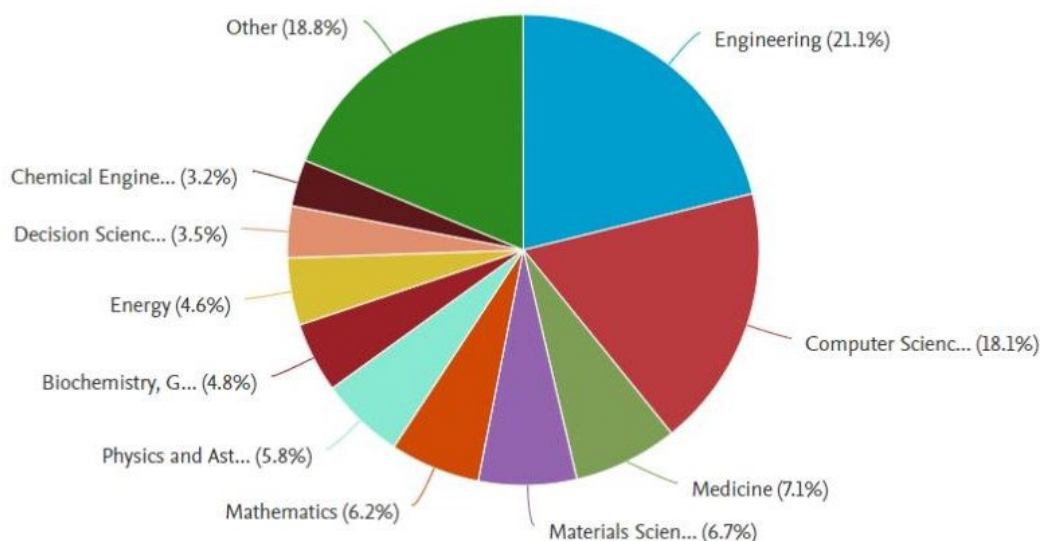


Fig 1: Subject-wise Analysis of Scopus Indexed Papers (Since inception as of 16th March 2024)

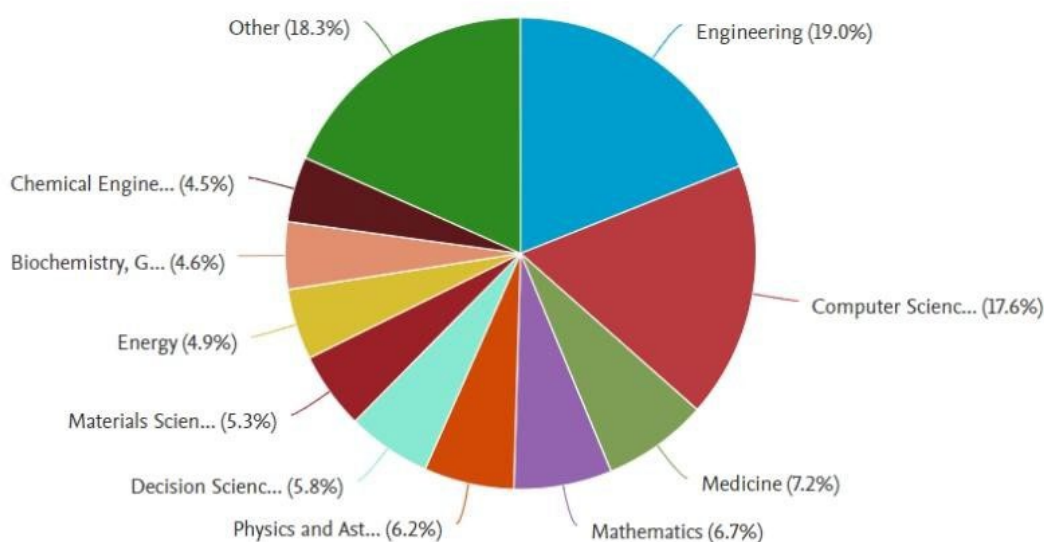


Fig 2: Subject-wise Analysis of Scopus Indexed Papers in 2023

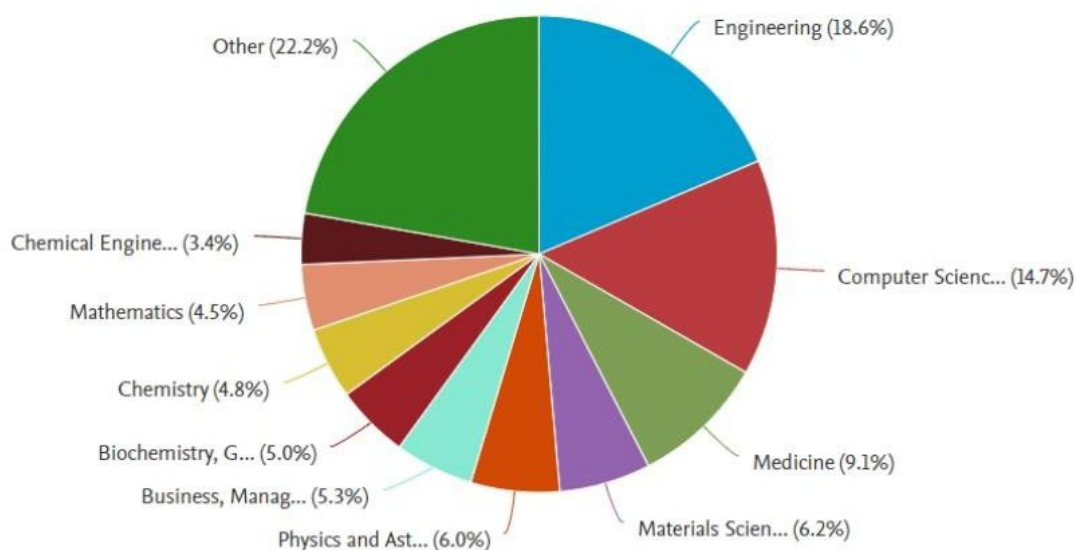


Fig 3: Subject-wise Analysis of Scopus Indexed Papers in 2024 as of 16th March'24

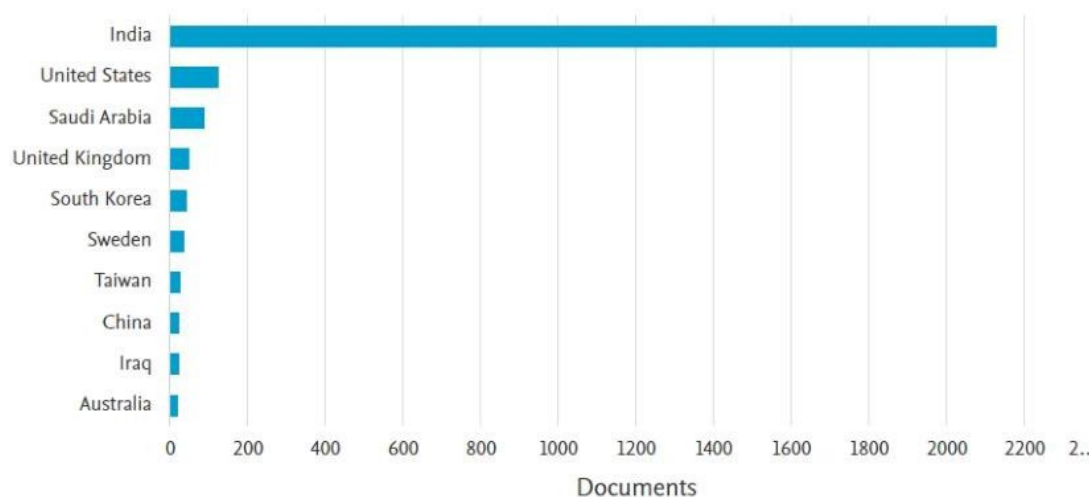


Fig 4: Collaborative Countries in 2023 (Scopus)

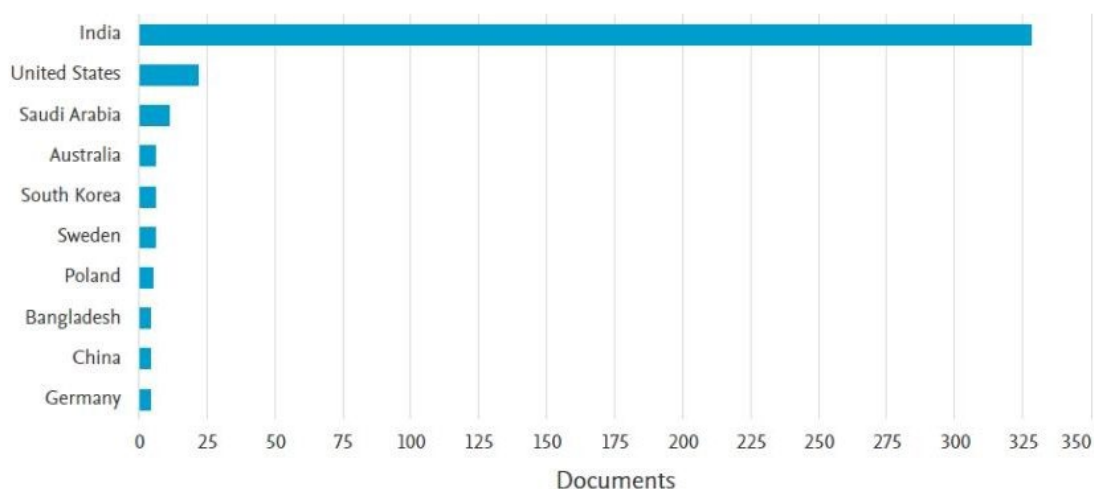


Fig 4: Collaborative Countries in 2024 as of 16th March 2024 (Scopus)

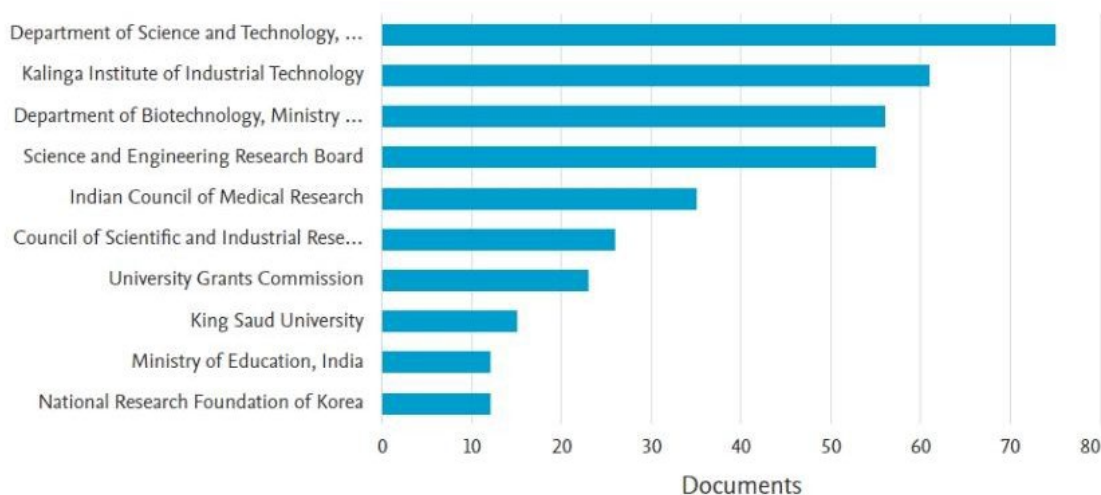


Fig 5: Funding Organizations in 2023 (Scopus)

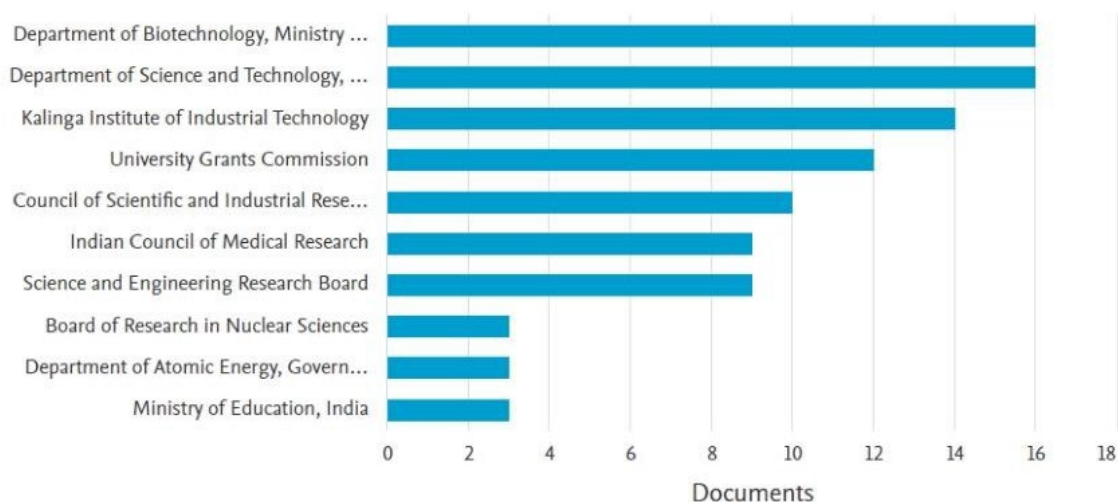


Fig 6: Funding Organizations in 2024 as of 16th March 2024 (Scopus)
